

**2018 marks the centenary of the birth of Nelson Mandela. This provides a unique opportunity for people around the world to reflect on his life to promote his legacy. **ROBBEN ISLAND**, Western Cape  
The “struggle university”, as it was known, held captive some of the greatest leaders that conducted South Africa to democracy, among them former President Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela. It’s South Africa’s *Statue of Liberty*. The visitors may visit the cell where the world’s most famous prisoner spent 18 of his 27 years in prison.

**MANDELA'S HOUSE**, Soweto, Gauteng  
 The number 8115, Vilakazi Street in Soweto is one of the most famous addresses in South Africa. It's the house where Nelson Mandela lived for 12 years with his first wife Evelyn during the apartheid regime. Vilakazi Street is also known for being the only street in the world where two Nobel Peace prize winners lived: Madiba and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. Renovated and transformed into a museum, it was declared a National Monument in 1999.

**SITE OF MANDELA'S CAPTURE,**  
 KwaZulu-Natal

On 5 August 1962, the police ordered a vehicle to stop on a secondary road in the KZN Province. Although disguised as a chauffeur, Mandela was sighted and imprisoned that day. A series of events followed which culminated in the Rivonia Trial and his incarceration for 27 years. This place is signalled today by an iron sculpture which creates an optical illusion: from far the 50 vertical bars don't have any significance, but at a distance of 35m they recreate Mandela's face.

**NELSON MANDELA VOTING LINE SCULPTURE**, Eastern Cape

To walk through the beautiful work of sculpture *Voting Line* in Port Elizabeth will allow you to experience the true sense of the rainbow nation. The many metal figures that represent all the communities in the country which voted peacefully on 27 April 1994, are present in the 38 m long piece. It depicts South Africans of all shapes and sizes who together gave birth to the new South Africa. At the end is Mandela with his raised fist, celebrating the victory of freedom and equality.
